Please note: item subjects brought to this scanning event must illustrate the historic founding, settlement, and development of the Burlington area. This can include old landscape photos, event photos, portraits of family who lived and grew up in Burlington, family pictures at Burlington locations, etc.

### Why is this important?

A community's history is captured through photographs and documents often tucked away in private homes. Sharing personal memories can actually enrich the community's history; digital scans ensure preservation of the stories, memories, and experiences unique to the people of Burlington.

Digital preservation is an on-going process and part of the Museum's collections policy. We hold these resources in trust for the benefit of future generations, while also providing ways to interact with the collections. We aim to make sure these memories can be accessed forever!

### Specifications

Only paper documents and photographs no larger than 11 inches by 17 inches, plus photo negatives and slides, will be digitized during community scan day. Items brought in may not collectively exceed over seven pages.

If items brought to the event cannot be scanned at that time for any reason, participants will receive information on how to schedule a follow-up appointment for one-on-one assistance or other recommendations.

Community scan day participants are encouraged to pre-register as slots will be limited.

MacNaughton Hermsen Britton Clarkson (MHBC) Planning Ltd. has made an application on behalf of the landowner to amend the Official Plan and Zoning Bylaw for the lands located at 1393 Graham's Lane. The application requests amendments to permit the development of three residential buildings with a combined total of 722 residential units, a density of 668.5 units per hectare and a total Floor Area Ratio of 4.25:1. Proposed Building A (east) is 16 storeys tall with 311 units, Building B (southwest) is 9 storeys tall with 125 units, and Building C (northwest) is 20 storeys tall with 286 units. The proposed development includes 598 vehicle parking spaces and 398 bicycle parking spaces. Application materials are posted at [burlington.ca/1393grahams](http://burlington.ca/1393grahams).

The application proposes to amend Zoning Bylaw site exception 504 to address some minor technical deficiencies including adjusting the overall number of stacked back-to-back townhouse units from 110 to 81; a reduction in 29 townhouse units; increase in the number of residential condominium units in Phase 2 from 124 to 166 units and an overall increase from 277 to 319 units. The other deficiencies include an increase in height for the rooftop mechanical and amenity space, a reduced underground parking setback to the Phase 1 line and amending the definition of stacked townhouse.

No changes are proposed to any of the minimum parking requirements as well as the current front, side, and rear yard setbacks.
