Johnsson Studio has applied on behalf of a private landowner to amend the Zoning By-law for the property located at 336 Appleby Line in Ward 4.

The subject land is currently designated 'Residential – Low Density' in the City of Burlington Official Plan (1997, as amended) as well as in the New Official Plan (2020). The applicable zoning of the subject lands is 'Residential – Low Density' (R2.4). The applicant is proposing to amend the Zoning By-law to permit the development of a semi-detached dwelling of two (2) storeys in height on two (2) separate lots fronting onto Cottonwood Drive.

Each unit will include two (2) parking spaces (one garage space and one driveway space), with an additional two (2) spaces provided as visitor parking onsite. The dwelling units are proposed to be three (3) storeys in height, with the potential for loft space to be added within the roof line of each unit. The design for each unit includes three (3) private amenity areas, including the proposed rear yard privacy areas, a raised rear deck, and a raised front deck (over the front porch). These spaces are augmented by individual front porches, and individual internal basement recreation room.

Details of the Potential Development

Branthaven Developments Inc. is proposing to redevelop the Subject Lands with a comprehensive residential development, consisting of both low-rise and mid-rise built forms. More specifically, the proposal provides for 83 townhouse units, which include rear-lane townhouse with frontage along Gallagher Road, 52 back-to-back townhouse units, for a total of 135 townhouse units, and an 8-storey mid-rise building with a total of 366 units. A total of 501 residential units are proposed. Each of the townhouse unit will be supported with individual driveway and garage parking.
